SF Green Building Code—city wide requirements

Timeline: aligned with state code adoption cycle

- 2008 LEED Silver
- 2012 LEED v3 Gold
- 2016 proposed LEED v4 Gold

Process

- DBI CAC Green Building Subcommittee
- DBI Code Advisory Committee
- Building Inspection Commission
- to Board of Supervisors in Sept.
- 2016 codes in effect Jan. 1, 2017



Timeline

- 1999 pre-LEED Municipal Green Building Ordinance
- 2004 LEED Silver
- 2011 LEED v3 Gold
- 2016 proposed LEED v4 Gold



- Board of Supervisors






SF Municipal LEED Portfolio






SF Municipal LEED square footage by year (millions)

What's New in LEED v4

Integrative Process

LEED USGBC V4

- Rainwater Management
- Building Envelope Commissioning
- Materials and Resources
- Indoor Environmental Quality



What's New in Env Code Chapter 7

Requirements:

- Title 24 2016 (~15% stricter than 2013)
- CalGreen 2016 (only minor changes)
 CalGreen compliance = 15 to 25 points in LEED v4
- LEED v4 Gold
- Better Roofs

Feasibility:

- Zero Net Energy (state goal by 2030)
- Solar Plus Energy Storage (Emergency Response and Community Resilience)




16 LEED v4 registered projects (over 2 million sf) at SFO





Cost of Green Building

- Massachusetts Case Study: v3 Gold to v4 Gold = 0.053% of total project cost
- San Francisco Case Study: updated and confirmed above study for local requirements and construction costs
- San Francisco comparison: CalGreen 2016 vs LEED v4—learning curve is biggest barrier
- Adapt SF Case Study for a municipal project
- Project Budgeting
