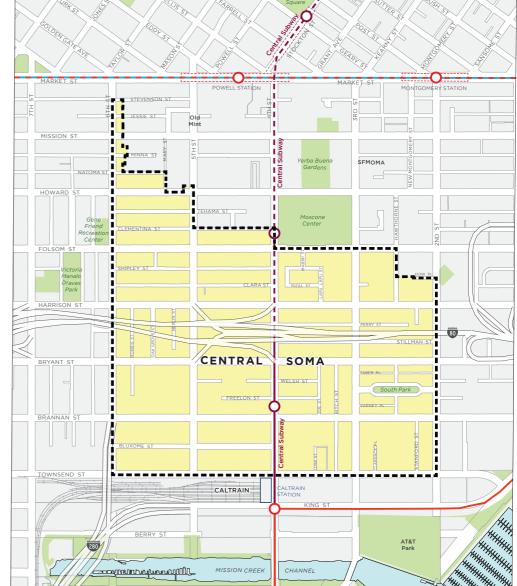

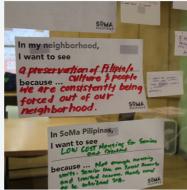

PUBLIC BENEFITS: TOTAL

No Plan = \$500 million in Public Benefits

Central SoMa Plan = \$2 Billion in Public Benefits

400% increase due to the Plan

Plus ~\$1 billion in increased General Fund tax revenues

POLICY & ADMINISTRATION TOPICS OF INTEREST

- Plan requires new oversight strategies for CFD. Proposal is to learn from our own experience to provide guidance for allocation, but flexibility to hinge as necessary.
- Local law proposed to be amended to enable CFD expenditure on social/ cultural programming and to enable faster escalation.
- There is discussion of splitting the ENCAC into two (SoMa and Mission/ Potrero/Central Waterfront). SoMa CAC could be merged with SoMa Stabilization (which handles social programming). There is timing uncertainty of both Plan adoption (pending Mayoral race) and timing of funding (pending Prop M ballot initiative).
- Plan proposes new benefits categories reflecting community and decisionmaker desires (environmental sustainability, community facilities, social/ cultural programming).
