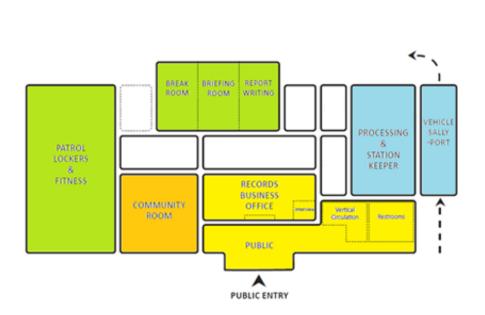

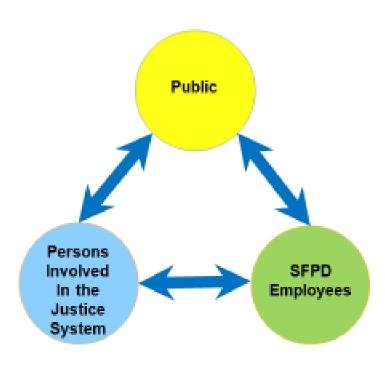

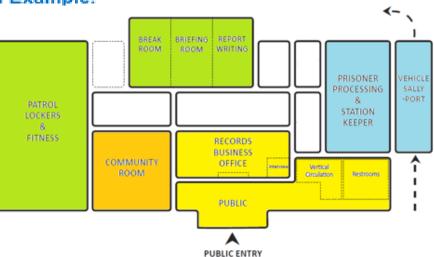
Central Station, 1969
