Bond Proposal Invests \$360M



Safe & Healthy Spaces

Invests in modern spaces across the City to expand access, care, and well-being, creating safe places to work, commute, and play



Emphasis on Equity

Invests in infrastructure for families with limited financial resources, limited English proficiency, and for persons with disabilities



Access for All

Invests in infrastructure city-wide, from street safety improvements and roadways to plazas and connections to transit

RELIABLE HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE

Ensuring access to safe and friendly spaces for patients and workers

Strengthening Citywide Health Network

Proposed \$167 Million

CHINATOWN PUBLIC HEALTH CENTER

Proposed \$71 Million



Serves over 4,500 patients annually for primary and specialized care for adults and families, particularly those whose primary language is Cantonese, Mandarin, or Toishanese.

Renovating the SHR4 building will:

- Improve patient and worker safety;
- Expand access to primary and dental care; and
- Modernize services and coordination, including with co-located Chinatown Children's Development Center

ZSFGH BUILDING 3 RETROFIT

Proposed \$40 Million



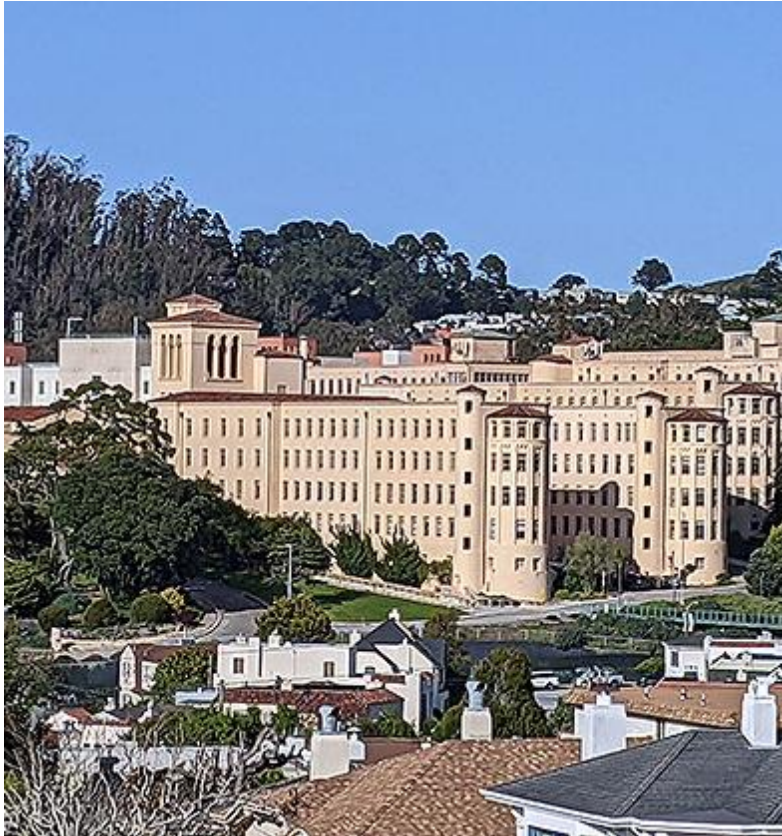
Renovates and adds over 65,000 sq ft of seismically safe workspace, minimizing physical threats during earthquakes to those who work and receive services in City buildings

Renovation includes:

- Seismic retrofit of building;
- Minor renovations to improve usability for employees; and
- Enables relocation out of SHR4 buildings across ZSFG

CRITICAL REPAIRS & INVESTMENTS

Proposed \$56 Million



Prioritizes Critical Investments in public hospitals by investing in aging critical infrastructure at LHH & ZSFG to ensure ongoing compliance and recertification

Funds priority infrastructure, such as:

- Emergency sewage containment;
- Fire alarm system replacement; and
- Mission-critical spaces for PES or Clinical Labs

Identifying new investments for families experiencing homelessness

Expanding opportunities for shelter acquisition and repair

Unlocks flexible funding to identify new investments in housing and shelter for families experiencing homelessness to help address critical shortages

- Reflects structure commonly employed in affordable housing bond to allow department to prioritize emerging opportunities

Safe & Pleasant Commutes in Vibrant Community Corridors

Proposed \$70 Million

VISION ZERO & SAFE STREETS



Road Safety & Improved Circulation

- Accelerates and enhances road safety projects citywide
- Include priority projects on the High Injury Network, such as the Sloat Blvd. / Great Highway Extension interchange



Pedestrian Safety & Improved Streetscapes

- Invests in pedestrian safety improvements citywide, including sidewalk widening, bulb-outs; and
- Improves engineering for multi-modal transit, prioritizing data-driven and community-based projects

Ensuring accessibility and safety for visitors and commuters

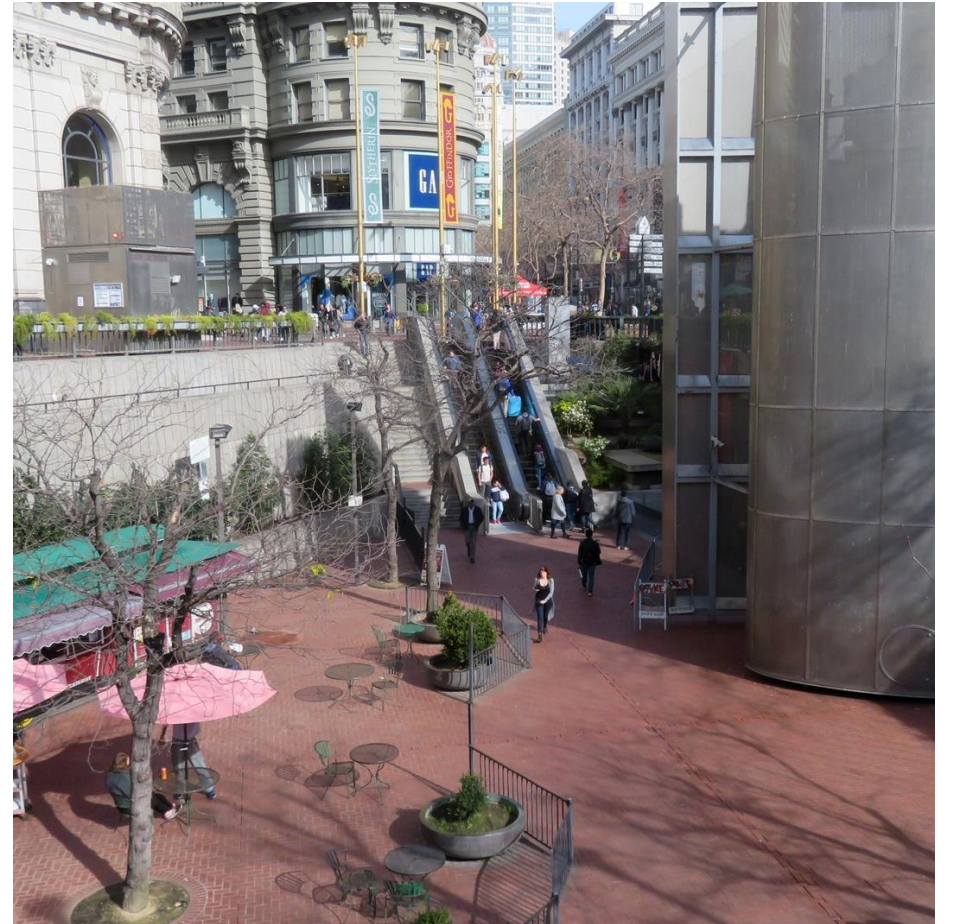
Proposed \$73 Million

MODERN & ACCESSIBLE DOWNTOWN

Proposed \$48 Million

Improves Access to Downtown and spurs economic development by modernizing public spaces around the neighborhood, such as Hallidie Plaza and the Cable Car turnaround, to make them more accessible, vibrant, and welcoming for all.

- Funds projects such as Hallidie Plaza accessibility improvements, ADA compliance, sidewalk improvements and transit access



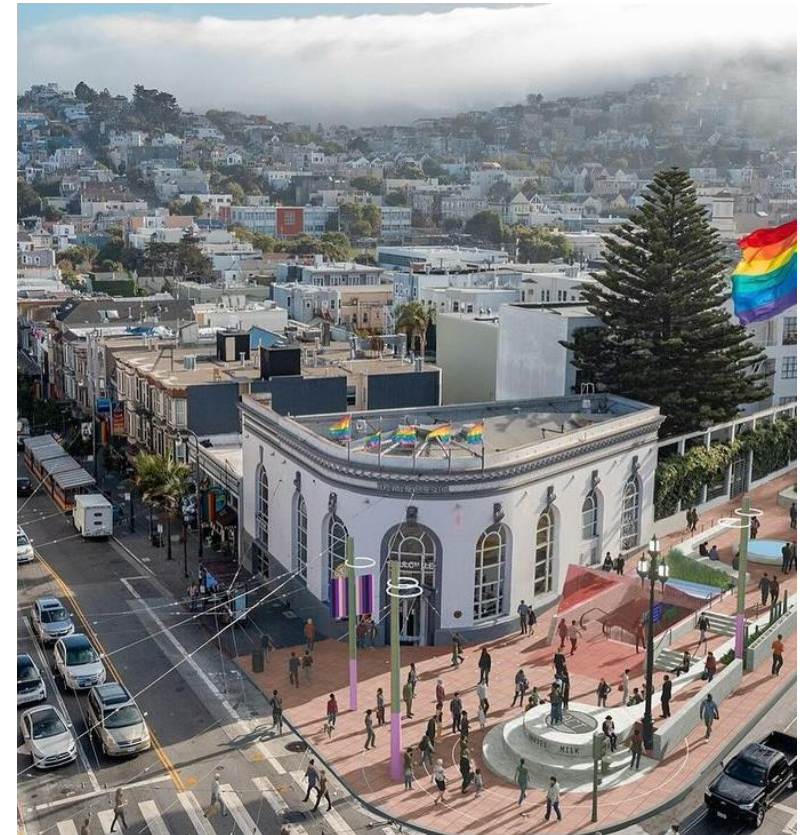
CELEBRATED COMMUNITY SPACES

Harvey Milk Plaza

Proposed \$25 Million

Dedicates funding for Harvey Milk Plaza, community-supported plaza and transit hub

- Completes Infrastructure phases (I & II) to improve accessibility, safety, and design at transit station
