

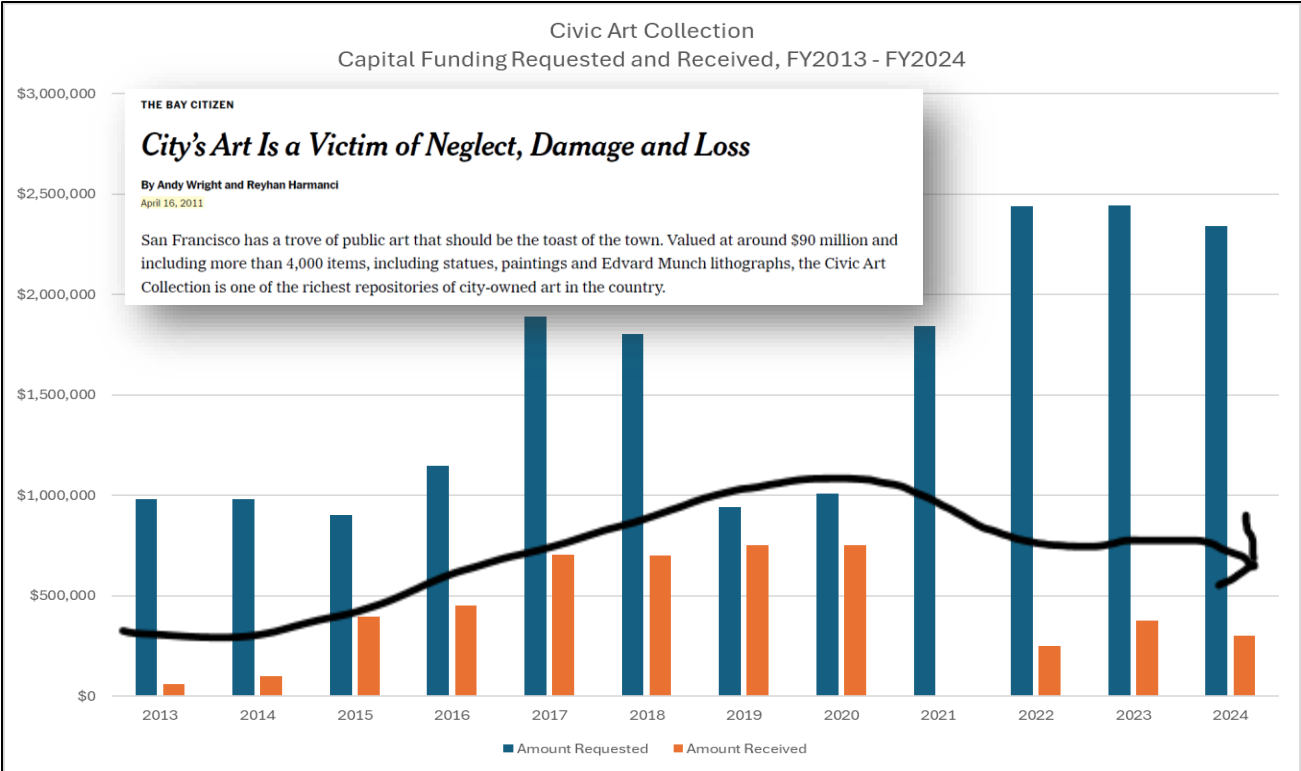

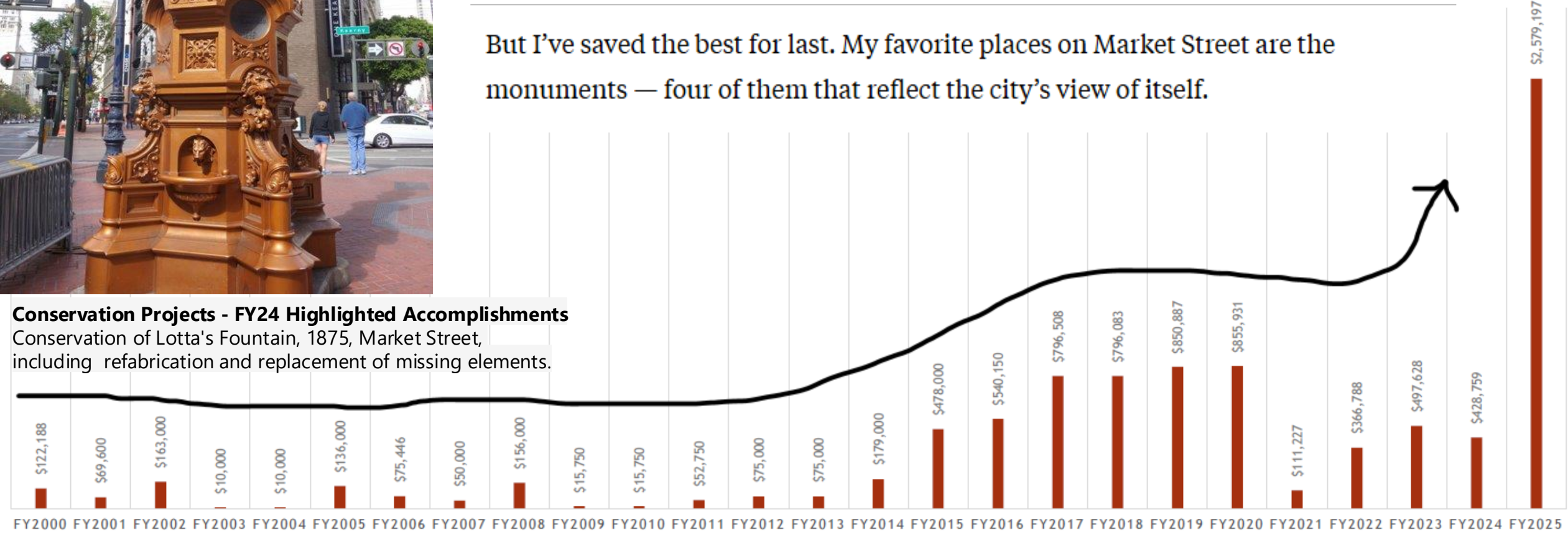

But I've saved the best for last. My favorite places on Market Street are the monuments — four of them that reflect the city's view of itself.

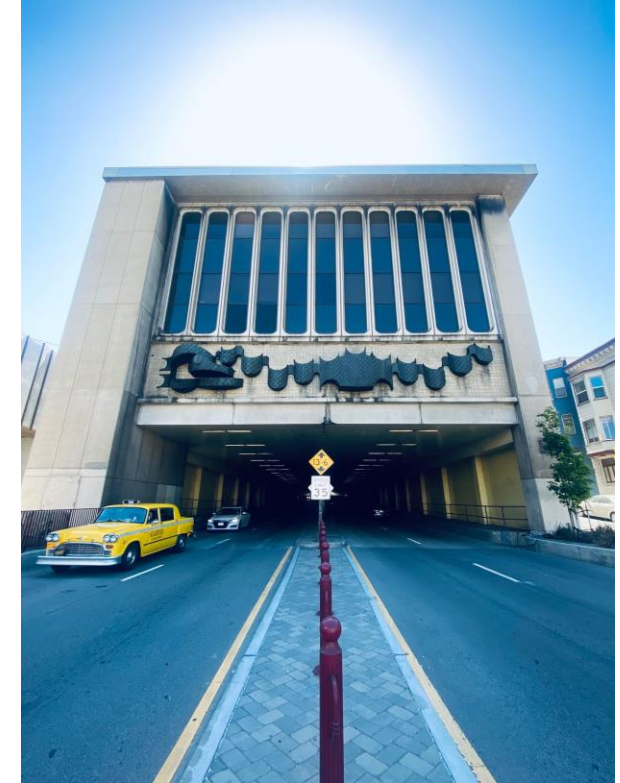
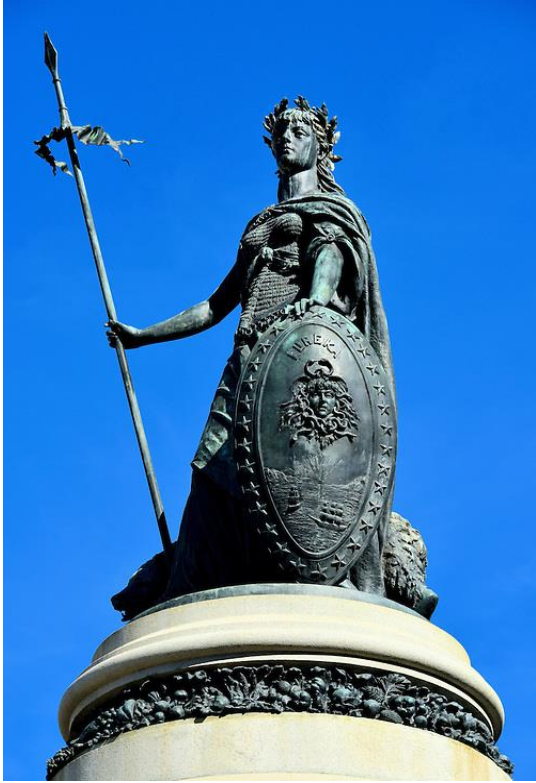
