As the one-year anniversary of the devastating Eaton and Palisades Wildfires approaches, the Lifelines Council will hear from Mr. Luis Ramirez, Deputy Director of Los Angeles County Public Works. The department provides lifeline infrastructure services of water, sewer, and transportation, in addition to building and development services to more than 10 million people in the Los Angeles region. Mr. Ramirez oversees the rebuilding and long-term recovery efforts for the unincorporated Altadena and Pacific Palisades communities impacted by the January 2025 wildfires. He will share his department's experiences and lessons learned from the restoration and recovery of lifeline infrastructure.

Following Mr. Ramirez's presentation, we will open the floor to the Lifelines Council for a Q&A and discussion.
