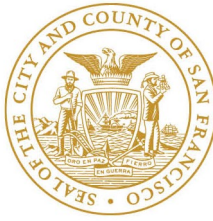

Public Comment

Public Comment will be taken in-person, either before or during the Committee's consideration of each agenda item. Speakers may address the Committee for up to two minutes. During General Public Comment, members of the public may address the Committee on matters that are within the Committee's jurisdiction but are not on today's agenda.

The COPs may also refund \$8,620,000 in outstanding 2018 Open Space revenue bonds.

Please limit your written comments to 3 pages maximum. Written public comment will be distributed to Committee members for their review before the relevant item is heard. If the written comment exceeds the 3 page maximum, only the first 3 pages will be distributed for Committee members to review. Distribution of any written material will not place the item on the Committee's agenda for discussion, nor obligate any Committee member to comment on such written material.

Know Your Rights Under the Sunshine Ordinance

Government's duty is to serve the public, reaching its decision in full view of the public. Commissions, boards, councils, and other agencies of the City and County exist to conduct the people's business. This ordinance assures that deliberations are conducted before the people and that City operations are open to the people's review.
